What is SARA

■ A uniform method across the nation which establishes a state-level reciprocity process to serve all interested states, accommodate all sectors of higher education, and support quality for distance education administered by the four existing regional compacts

Benefits

- States
- Institutions
- Students

Implementation

- State Level
 - State law includes a reasonable definition of physical presence, for purposes of interstate reciprocity
 - State law allows participation in the reciprocity agreement
 - Identify lead SARA agency
 - Adopt in-state funding model if needed
 - Submit application to RSC
- Institutional Level
 - Apply through home state
 - Demonstrate on an annual basis that they comply with all standards and requirements

Massachusetts Update

- Surveyed all AICUM institutions, 23 responses were submitted
 - Half of the respondents were only authorized to offer distance education in 0-5 states, enrolling 0-50 students
 - Only <u>three</u> institutions offered distance education to more than 400 students
- Almost all respondents expected to enroll in SARA if Massachusetts applied and was approved
